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What do you think of the statements made by these children about rounding numbers?

To round to the nearest thousand, look at the digit in the hundreds place; if it is 5 or more round up' it is less than 5 round down.



Megan

To round to the nearest thousand, keep the digit in the thousand place the same and change the other digits to zero.



Mia

To round to the nearest thousand, look at the digit in the ones place - if it is bigger than 5 round up; if it is lower than 5 round down.
